Our stake president obtained permission from the General SS Board for it to be taught during SS. I think the gal at BYU is doing it in the evenings. There's so much more that could be said and added, if it were to be a real book. But at least it's a jumping-off point for folks and a lot of information has been brought together in one place.

We didn't have a citation for it before so had not included it, but just last week found the citation (the last sentence in Lesson 11 of our RS/PH manual, Pres.
